There were some outstanding performances which resulted in students being selected for County athletics on Saturday 14th June.








County Championships

In the County Championships, two of our students became County Champions...Oliver won the discus and Skye won the Javelin event.







Skye has had an unbelievable season and has won so many medals and championships.

Here are a list of her achievements this season:

- Northern indoor shot putt title in January.
- U18 javelin silver medallist at Loughborough University in March.
- Scottish National Indoor Championship silver medallist in the shot putt.
- North Eastern Counties Indoor Champion in both the shot putt and the triple jump.
- North Eastern Counties Outdoor Champion in the discus, shot putt and the javelin. (Breaking the championship records in the shot and javelin).
- Northern Outdoor Championships at Liverpool -shot putt and javelin champion. (javelin won with a distance of 41.30m).
- Durham County Schools javelin Champion.
- Inter-counties Championships at Middlesbrough-the intercounties javelin and shot putt champion.
- Chosen for the English Schools Championships at Birmingham's Alexander Stadium in the Intermediate Girls javelin.
- Qualified for the English Age Group Championships for javelin and shot at Birmingham in August.

What a fantastic season and due to all her hard work and successes she is currently ranked 8th in the UK for javelin in her age group and 12th for shot putt.

Finally, Skye threw a new PB of 41.34m which was enough to finish 4th place overall out of the 17 girls taking part in English School Athletics.

As Skye is in Year 11-she will be leaving us this year and we wish her every success with her future in sport!
