The Maths department would love your support in encouraging your child to complete their compulsory Maths homework. Homework teaches discipline, responsibility, and improves self confidence. ## Need some support with logging in to Sparx Maths?

- 1. Students can log into Sparx Maths using their Google account:
  - Login to realsmart <a href="https://smartlogin.realsmart.co.uk/smartlogin/launchpad">https://smartlogin.realsmart.co.uk/smartlogin/launchpad</a>
  - Open Google Mail on your realsmart dashboard
  - Open new tab on internet browser
  - Select "Student Login"
  - Select "Log in to Sparx using Google"
- 2. If a student does not have access to their google account at home they can create a password:
  - Go to Sparx Maths Login Page
  - Click "Forgotten login details?"
  - Select "Student"
  - Enter your details: first name, last name and date of birth, then click
     "Submit"
  - Set your new password
  - Remember to write it down for next time

Students can ask their maths teacher at any time for support with logging in, or they can attend "The Hub" homework club on Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays 3:15pm-3:45pm for additional support.

Students are aware they should be writing down their bookwork codes, workings and answers in their homework booklet in order to pass their "bookwork checks", they can ask for a replacement booklet any time.

### Year 11 Intervention

Year 11 Intervention will commence after Half Term. The purpose of this focused support is to ensure the best possible outcomes for every student. By targeting key knowledge and examination skills, we aim to enable each student to secure the necessary grades to choose their desired path in life, whether that be further education, a vocational apprenticeship, or entering the world of work.

English, Maths, and Science intervention will be incorporated into the afternoon registration period. This approach ensures regular, dedicated revision time for all students in these core subjects.

Specific support will be provided in after-school sessions for students who have been selected by their subject teacher. Selection is based on current progress data and assessments to ensure support is delivered where it is most needed. These sessions will run from 3.15pm to 4.15pm and attendance is compulsory for all students who have been asked to attend.

We recognise that this requires an additional commitment from your child and greatly appreciate your support in ensuring their prompt attendance every day. We are confident that this dedicated approach will significantly enhance your child's prospects and performance. Please contact the school office should you have any queries.

# Deal or No Deal
